"Redeeming Love"— Author: Francine Rivers (Recommended Read – Book not in Our Library)

Francine Rivers is a popular Christian author who has written many books. This book is available from the Pikes Peak Library system.

This book is loosely based on the Old Testament book of Hosea. The main male character in the book is named Michael Hosea. Just as Hosea is commanded by God in the book of Hosea to marry a woman who would be unfaithful to him, Michael Hosea is also commanded by God to marry a woman who would be unfaithful to him and cause him many heartaches. (The Bible book of Hosea parallels Hosea's relationship with his unfaithful wife, Gomer, with God's relationship with the nation of Israel.)

In this book, the person who becomes Michael Hosea's wife is Sarah/Angel who had been sold into prostitution at the age of 8. Angel expects nothing from men but betrayal and she survives by keeping her hatred alive. Then she meets Michael Hosea. He is a man who seeks his Heavenly Father's heart in everything, so he obeys God's call to marry Angel and to love her unconditionally.

Slowly, day by day, Michael defies Angel's every bitter expectation, until despite her resistance, her frozen heart begins to thaw. But with her unexpected softening comes overwhelming feelings of unworthiness and fear. Her final healing must come from the One who loves her even more than Michael does ... the One who will never let her go. The book tells the story that no matter how far we have strayed, God is always willing to forgive and love us.

This timeless classic is a powerful retelling of the book of Hosea. "Redeeming Love" is a life-changing story of God's unconditional, redemptive, all-consuming love.
