The first verse now holds even greater meaning for me when I more recently found Saint Paul concluded it with this statement “– of whom I am the worst!” (Sinner). For many years I was not willing to become more active in the church because of my many sins – until I better understood that all men are sinners, including Saint Paul.

(Sandy) John 3:16 – “God so loved the world that he gave his one and only begotten son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.” A very, very simple way to tell others about the Gospel of Christ.


## Jigsaw Puzzle Exchange

“For me, to live is Christ and to die is gain. If I am to go on living in the body this will mean fruitful labor for me. Yet what shall I choose? I do not know! I am torn between the two: I desire to depart and be with Christ, which is better by far; but it is more necessary for you that I remain in the body.” Philippians 1:21-24

These words of Paul were penned when he was in prison, facing persecution and not knowing what the future held. Yet today many of us can relate. Perhaps you too have wondered why you are still alive. For me, seven years ago I was preparing mentally to die. I was pretty reconciled to it, in fact. And yet today I am still alive and I have been granted by my Lord so much that I mourned as forever lost to me. And this leaves me in a quandary. There are times, times of suffering, pain, and anguish, when I long for Jesus to return NOW! When I pray that I might depart this life. I know that many of you also struggle in this way. Perhaps loved ones have already departed, perhaps your body is failing you slowly or quickly. Perhaps you look on as someone you love suffers. And you wonder for what purpose you (or they) are still alive.

Perhaps you will never know the answer to that question. Or perhaps you will. Sometimes it is indeed harder to live clinging to Jesus than to die. Yet that is what we are called to do. If indeed you are reading this, and the spirit of Christ which you received in your Baptism and in Communion dwells in you, your labor is fruitful. It is difficult, yes. Yet we can say with Paul “for ME (put your name here) to live is Christ and to die is gain.” May this be our prayer!
