Praying Like Abraham

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ Jesus,

With all the disasters we've witnessed around the nation in recent weeks – fires, floods, drought, and more – there has been ample opportunity for prayer. But then I read this recent proclamation: “Now, therefore, I Barack Obama, president of the United States of America, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the United States, do hereby proclaim June, 2011 as Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender Pride Month.”

I'm sorry, but I choked. Yes, I would agree with the intent of our Founding Fathers that there should be no prejudice, persecution, and there should be fairness for all. But to require by presidential proclamation that all Americans show “pride” in what I believe to be perversion? Celebration? I cannot and I will not. So bring on the Political Correctness police.

But then I thought, “Will I pray for them?” Maybe I'm just getting old and cranky. But I was reading in Genesis chapter eighteen and noted that Abraham was 99 years old when the Lord paid him a visit. During the visit, the Lord revealed that He was about to smite Sodom and Gomorrah because of their great sinfulness. And four times Abraham interceded on behalf of the cities, praying that the Lord might spare them.

But precisely what was Abraham praying for, or whom? He was praying for the righteous living amongst the wicked. And for the sake of the righteous, the Lord was willing to withhold His judgment. Sadly, not even ten righteous could be found within the city.

We do not celebrate wickedness, lifestyles chosen in direct offense to the Word of God. But we can pray for the nation, for the cities, that people might have time to hear the Word of the Lord and turn toward Him in repentance and seek His mercy.

In His High-Priestly Prayer, Jesus on the night of His arrest, prayed these words, “I ask on their behalf (believers); I do not ask on behalf of the world, but of those whom Thou hast given Me; for they are Thine... I have given them Thy Word; and the world has hated them, because they are not of the world, as I am not of the world” (John 17:9, 14).

Jesus and the Word are very clear about the Law. But then Jesus went to the Cross. And there He died for all – for us who believe, but also for the lesbian, the gay, the bisexual, and the transgender. Because all sin needed forgiveness. Yes, the Gospel is just as clear.

So what do we do with the presidential proclamation? Celebrate diversity with pride? No. But we can pray. We can pray that the Lord does withhold judgment for a time. And then we use that time to continue to proclaim the truth of Scripture. A truth which this world does not want to hear. A truth for which it will hate us. That is Jesus' promise. But we, too, have been forgiven. We have been called into His Kingdom. And so while time remains for us here, we continue to share that amazing Good News.

What is in a Name?

What does your name mean? Does it say something about you? Does it reflect the hopes that your parents had for you, a favorite relative, or your mother's love of the poetic sound? I think back to Shakespeare- "What's in a name? That which we call a rose by any other name would smell as sweet" said by Juliet to Romeo. Now, Juliet was pretty much saying that she loved Romeo for the man that he was, but not his family who was feuding with her own. While we culturally use this quote to mean something like "a name doesn't matter" it seems to me that in the context of the play the name in fact WAS important. This is shown by the fact that in the following lines Juliet asks Romeo to deny his family and the name Montague, and take on a new name- "Lover." Which of course leads to the tragic ending that we all know about- since Romeo's family wasn't too keen on his name change.



I think, though, that the common usage of this quote reflects what we as a culture think about names. They are mostly just used to differentiate between people- that is Bob and that if Bob doesn't like his name he can just go down to the Social Security office and change it. But it doesn't necessarily reflect anything about him or his life.

I contrast this with the way people in the Bible named their children. Take Jacob for example. His name means "he deceives" and was given to him for the reason that he was born grasping his brother Esau's heel. This name of "deceiver" ended up reflecting the entire first portion of his life, until he wrestled with God and the latter re-named him "Israel" meaning "he struggles with God."

Jesus also was given a name by God- in the Old Testament in Isaiah 7:14 we are told "the virgin will be with child and will call his name "Immanuel"- it means "God with us." When Mary and Joseph are given the actual street name for the second person of the trinity who has become a human- the Son of Mary, they are given "Jesus" (the Greek version of the Hebrew Joshua)- which means "God saves." Clearly this little baby was named for the purpose of his life- to save us from sin, death, and the devil. He is also called "Christ"- which is the Greek for "Messiah" meaning "the anointed one." As this little boy grows up, he adds to the repertoire of names as he reveals more of God and more of his purpose on earth. I love it when we have the names of God banners up in the sanctuary. It helps to focus on God, who He is, and what He has done for us on the cross.

This year during VBS we will be contemplating names. The names that our parents give us, the names that were given to Jesus, and most especially the name that we all are given in our baptism, when we became children of God. And that is what we are. May we grow to be all that this name means.

Sports Update!


Hello sports fans! It's that time of year again to dust off the cobwebs from the ball glove and bat, and start softball season!


