The View from the Top

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ Jesus,

It's been a nice long journey through the season of Epiphany, one of the longest. On March 6 we finally reach the mountain top – Transfiguration Sunday. I love driving into our church parking lot every morning and lifting my eyes up to see Pikes Peak with the sun shining brightly on the snow this time of year. Psalm 121 always comes to mind: "I will lift up my eyes to the mountains; From whence shall my help come? My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth."

I'm guessing that most of you have been to the top of Pikes Peak. What could you see from there? The city stretched out below you, plains to the east, the Collegiate Peaks to the west. Such an amazing view. At the very beginning of His ministry, the devil took Jesus to the top of a very high mountain (Matthew 4:8) and tried to tempt Jesus with all the kingdoms of the world and all their glory. But Jesus had known a far more glorious perspective, Jesus' hands had spread out the entire heavens and earth in the moments of Creation. Jesus had a far better vision than any the devil could offer, His glory outshone any small glory in the kingdoms of this world.

And now, up on the mountain with Jesus, the disciples were privileged to get a glimpse of that glory as Jesus was Transfigured before their eyes, His face shining like the sun. All the glories of the world became insignificant to them in that moment. They wanted to remain there with that vision. But it wasn't to be.

And Jesus led them back down the mountain on one last journey, a road that led to a Cross. And on another little hill outside the walls of Jerusalem Jesus was lifted up in glory one more time, a very different picture of glory. John 12:23, 32, Jesus said, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified... And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to Myself."

The true glory of Christ Jesus is seen on the Cross. His love and sacrifice for us was displayed for all the world to see. We did not stand upon the Mount of Transfiguration or on the hill of Calvary. But the disciples recorded the story for us. And we do see with hearts of faith, enabled by the Spirit to see and to believe that in Jesus we have a Savior whose glory outshines all Creation.

And so we will once again begin a Lenten journey to the Cross with Jesus on March 9, Ash Wednesday. During our Wednesday evening special services we will seek to see Christ Jesus and His glory a little bit clearer, improve our vision through some of the stranger places of Scripture: Two Tablets of Stone, a Few Vessels of Oil, a Field, and others. So come, join brothers and sisters on the journey, seeking the Christ and His glory.

A Season of Reflection

What are your associations with the word "Lent?" In our church family it may bring to mind delicious, shared meals and evening worship services. If you were brought up in a Catholic setting, perhaps you remember fish on Fridays and fasts. Perhaps during these 40 days preceding Easter you make a practice of fasting by "giving up" something.

A wise person once suggested to me that instead of fasting by removing a particular item, I might actually ADD something - a more concentrated devotion, prayer, or service time that would deepen my relationship with Jesus. That is the ultimate purpose of fasting- to clear up more time and space for Christ. With hectic, busy schedules jam-packed with activities and expectations, this may be the more difficult sacrifice.

My intention is not to lay on guilt- after all we are under grace here! But there are several things that you might be able to "add" to your Lenten fast this year.

Joining together in fellowship to break bread during the Lenten Meals is a possibility, and then your stomach and heart will be ready to worship!

Enjoy reading? Try a Christian classic like "Pilgrim's Progress" or "Luther's Small Catechism." Just 5 minutes of reading will give you food for thought for an entire day!

Turn on some Christian Music while you are driving- hymns, radio stations, or kids' cd's all offer something different.

If you are a lady, join us on April 1 and 2 for the retreat.

Participate in a Bible Study- Sunday Morning, 1st and 3rd Thursday Mornings, or 1st and 3rd Monday evenings for Women.

Perhaps you can set aside a brief time, even once a week, for your entire household, your family, to enjoy time together with Jesus in His Word.

May this Lenten season be a time of adding to your faith and your walk with our Crucified and Risen Lord.

Ukraine Mission

As the Ukraine team prepares for their 2011 trip, I wanted to take a moment to reflect on the wonderful relationships with which we have been blessed for the duration of the mission. As you may recall, our chosen verse for last year's trip came from Ephesians 4:3, which says, "Eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace." It has been with these words studied and on our hearts that we have looked forward to each opportunity to assist our brothers and sisters in Ukraine, knowing that this "unity of Spirit" is not only amongst the ROA team members, but shared with those assisting us on the field.

Although much of our preparation goes towards organizing the two weeks spent abroad, we know that there are fifty other weeks of the year where we cannot be in person to support the Christian growth of a country in need. That being said, it is during these additional weeks of the year that we support through prayer, continued communication, and special projects (such as the shoeboxes), in an effort to demonstrate our heart for those in Ukraine.

Our contacts in Ukraine work with us and each other throughout the year to not only prepare for the team's time on the field but also to continue building the Church in what can be, at times, an environment hostile to Christianity. It is with their support that we as a team have been and, prayerfully, will continue to be blessed with a successful mission, both during our times there and our times away.

The team of five from Rock of Ages last year quickly became a team of seven, thanks to Alexi, our contact in Ukraine and pastor of a church there. Alexi has always helped to find us translators, and in the past two years they have been translators rooted in the Christian faith. Zhenya and Dima, our two translators in 2010, helped to make us an affective team by providing meaningful translation during presentations and even helping to rewrite portions of skits in Russian/Ukrainian so that they would be better received. We continue to communicate with them, although we are not certain if they will again translate for the team.

To the extent that it is always the team's passion to model Christian fellowship to the people of Ukraine, it is incredible the degree to which they demonstrate this very thing to us. The pastors and their families with whom we work consistently exhibit Christian brotherhood through their relationships with one another. Their apparent joy with each opportunity to see each other (which is considered a treat since they are separated by many miles) is a wonderful example of the joy that we should all feel when greeting one another.

It has been and continues to be such a blessing to work with each of the people who make the mission possible, both those from our church and those in Ukraine. Although I will not be joining the team in Ukraine this upcoming summer, I will continue to feel a part of that vast collection of individuals who, with the help of God, keep the mission alive and well.


