Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ Jesus,

What does it mean to be blessed? This month we celebrate that holiday of Thanksgiving. A time to count our blessings. But so many this year might not be feeling that blessed. As part of God's family we tend to associate that term with religious thoughts or parts of our worship life. But even there it can be misunderstood. A little four-year-old who liked watching football with his father at home watched the pastor raise his hands at the end of worship to pronounce the blessing. The little guy immediately jumped to his feet and shouted "Touchdown!" Or the pastor who was conducting a wedding ceremony for a couple not totally familiar with worship customs. The pastor raised his hand to bless the couple and the bride, misunderstanding the gesture, surprised him with a "high five." Not wanting to exclude the groom, the pastor offered him a high-five also.

So what does it mean to give a blessing or to be blessed? When someone sneezes we often respond, "God bless you." Where did that come from? There are many ancient legends. But in the 14th century, during the time of the Black Plague, Pope Gregory VII decreed that people who heard a sneeze should respond with "God bless you."

Most of us would probably say that we are blessed, even in these difficult times. And we are. But perhaps not in the ways we commonly think. In His famous Beatitudes, Jesus offers us a totally different direction: "Blessed are the poor in spirit... blessed are those who mourn... blessed are the meek... Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of Me." "Oh, come on now, Jesus. Do You really expect that to fly? That is not how this world works."

Let me tell you about a great definition of blessed. It comes from the rock star Bono of the rock group U2. He was invited by President Bush to speak at the National Prayer Breakfast years ago (when we still had them). Bono was led to focus on the needs of the poor, especially in Africa. He said that in countless ways he was always seeking after the Lord's blessings. But then he met a wise old man who advised him to stop asking God to bless what he was doing and get involved in what God is doing – because it is already blessed.

Get involved in what God is doing. God is with the poor, the meek, the persecuted. Are we? We are indeed all very blessed. I have no doubt. But are you blessed in the way that Christ would have you be blessed? Do your values reflect His values? Particularly in regard to our love for our neighbors? Do we see our blessings as being in His presence and His work or do we see blessings as stuff? Stuff can be a real hindrance to being blessed.

Saints are people who know what it is to be blessed, not in the way this world understands blessings, but in the way Christ Jesus modeled blessedness for us. Are you blessed? Really blessed?

Be a Bold Witness for God – Wear the Cross of Christ

I returned from my second trip to Ukraine last June somewhat uncertain about the impact of my mission this year. At first I did not feel that I had as much impact this year as last year. Through much of July, I was seriously considering not going back to Ukraine again. Then the Holy Spirit had me stop and consider the actual facts about the mission trip this past June. Some of the details of my searching review:

This year there were 6 team members, so there was less actual work for me to do than when there were only 5 team members in 2010. It is clear to me that we don't need to send a team of 6 people again. But for our 2012 mission we are having problems getting team members – the 3 youngest members from this year's team will not be able to go next year. And even some of the older members are not certain about going next year. The Holy Spirit "told" me to go in February of 2010, and I will never regret that decision. You need to listen carefully to hear if the Holy Spirit is telling you to go to Ukraine in 2012.

During the mission in June I wore around my neck a 2+ inch tall stainless steel Cross with a black insert on the front – only taking it off to sleep. There was a team t-shirt with a cross and a message on it, but this can't be worn all of the time. I was able to wear my cross and proclaim Christ to all who saw it – everywhere we went. My intention was to be a bold witness for God. When I thought back on this witnessing, here is what I realized:

When we arrived in Mykolaiv, the team was invited to meet with Ministry of Education officials responsible for orphanages in the area. We drove downtown, went to the Ministry offices and met with the Minister and her assistant. They simply wanted to meet us and to take our measure. They appeared satisfied and immediately invited our team to visit their large (over 600 children) summer camp for orphans on the Black Sea – The Little Eagle Camp. This was unheard of for Ukraine – government officials (not that far removed from the old Soviet Union) actually requesting our Christian presence at one of their facilities. We quickly changed our plans and advised them that we would be delighted to go to this camp the next morning. Later that day, we heard these same officials wanted to meet with us again just before we departed for this camp. The next morning we returned to take pictures and for them to wish us well. The Minister was wearing a cross around her neck, about the size of mine.

When we arrived at The Little Eagle Camp, we first met with the man who was the camp manager responsible for all operations. He then turned us over to the woman who was responsible for children's programs. Both were very friendly and cooperative. The next day and also the following day, this woman was wearing a cross about the size of mine. It was clear to me that both cross wearers were already Christian, but were shy about showing it in public. I hope that my wearing of the cross was responsible for them both publicly to wear their own cross – particularly the woman who dealt each day with so many children.

We don't know all of the effects our presence in Ukraine has on people. I've told you about those I witnessed on the spot. But we also saw a delayed effect from our visit last year when we returned to the TB Sanatorium near Mykolaiv. This year there was not the difficulty getting into this facility and we were allowed to stay longer. (Last year the Millers negotiated for 45 minutes for us to only be allowed about 30 minutes with the children.) When we arrived at the same room we presented in last year, the walls had been painted with a few Bible scenes, and there were pages with written Bible verses taped on the walls. It seems there was a nurse who last year had seen us from the hall. After we left, she decided that if God had sent us so far to visit her hospital, she needed to do something – and she did. We were told that the pages of Bible verses were removed during government inspections, and then taped back up again after they are over.

The Holy Spirit wants us to be bold in proclaiming our Lord Jesus Christ. I believe all team members in the future need to wear a cross during the full mission. For such a simple effort, the value of wearing a symbol of our Lord's sacrifice transcends all barriers.




