The 12 Stones of Ukraine

The most difficult question to answer when I return from Ukraine is “How did the trip go?” It’s difficult because there are so many responses. Do I answer as a blessed American and say “Good. The out-houses were not that bad this year.” Or, should I respond as a person who can worship freely with “It seems like the official response to churches is not as cool as it was.” If I reply to the question as a child of God, then my answer may be a while in coming. There are times, when in Ukraine, that I could see God working right then and there. However, God makes so many things happen that it’s beyond human capacity to be aware of all of them when they are occurring. With some things, you don’t realize it until you’re home. That’s what happened to me this year when I unpacked twelve small stones.

I picked up the stones on the shore of the Black Sea. We were at a summer camp for orphans – over 600 of them – and it had been a couple of very fast and active days. We were returning to Odessa later that morning to head back home. I was walking along the rocky beach letting the trip wash over me, skipping stones into the waves. When I climbed the stairs back to our rooms, I still had some stones in my pocket. I pushed them into my bag and forgot about them.

That is until I was unpacking a few days later at my home. I came across the stones, a dozen in all. As I held them, feeling their surfaces, some smooth, some not, I thought about how God commanded Joshua to set up twelve stones at Gilgal to commemorate the Israelites’ safe crossing of the Jordan River. Joshua told the Israelites that God held the waters back so that “all the peoples of the earth might know that the hand of the Lord is powerful.” (Joshua 4:24) I smiled as I held these twelve stones of Ukraine. In an instant, I recalled twelve times in Ukraine when I witnessed the power of the Lord.

Some of these times were what you might expect – things happening so perfectly that it could only be God working. Others were so subtle that I didn’t connect the dots until later. In the next several months, the team will share some of these reflections with you. For now, I’ll relay one small yet powerful example of God at work.

We were playing with the kids at an orphanage outside of Savron. Last year, we had seen some of these kids when visiting. There was a girl about 13 who I immediately remembered. This year, like last year, she stood away from the group, reacting with anger at anyone who came near. Yet, she watched us carefully. It seemed like she wanted to play but something – past abuse, the harsh life she lives – held her back. When she shoved a kid who had invited her to join us, I silently prayed, “God, let her know its okay to have fun.” Within minutes, she joined in and was laughing and smiling.

A couple of minutes of fun will not erase the pain that girl has suffered in her young life. But I know that the same God who held back the waters of the Jordan can also hold back the anguish in that girl long enough to carve a handhold into her heart. The Spirit does not need much to blow where It will.
